

22-23 HNES Highlights

- 22-23 student enrollment increased by 10%
- Parent feedback was collected through survey requests.

- BASE served over 400 meals at our Thanksgiving Family Luncheon!
- Grandfriends' Day had the highest attendance rate in the history of the event.

SAFETY & SECURITY

- School Resource Officer addition coming 23-24
- Hardening of the front entryway (upon approval)
- More magnetic locks for main entry points
- Hallway window coverings
- Blinds for all classrooms
- Screens for perimeter fences







Facilities & Grounds

- The Tennis Court resurfacing project was completed along with the addition of pickleball court lining.
- The Brick Walkway along William's Field was repaired.
- The elementary playground equipment was replaced, and Mrs. Mowat secured a grant of \$30,000.00 to offset the cost.
- The 5th grade Portable was removed to make room for HNES future building expansion.
- The conceptual drawings were created for the proposed future STEM building.







22-23 Fiscal Achievements

- Holy Nativity Foundation Board created an endowment with approximately \$250,000.00
- Secured over \$50,000.00 in EANS (COVID Funding) purchases at no cost to the school.
- Received donations totaling approximately \$80,000.00 (outside of Fundraising efforts).
- Secured Title II funds to pay for our contracted counseling through Angel House.
- Secured Title I funding to help pay for qualifying students in need of academic intervention.

ommunity Foundation

- Grants Received:
 - St Joe Community Foundation awarded HNES \$12,000.00 for our "Get Stoked for STEAM" initiative to further enhance our STEM Curriculum.
 - A grant for playground equipment totaled \$30,000.00.
 - The Restart Grant (following Hurricane Michael) concluded with a payment of \$8,700.




